Sandy Magaña will present research on disparities in health and specialty services between Latino and White families, and will discuss a psycho-educational intervention to empower Latino families of children with autism.

Through this seminar series, IDDRC investigators studying issues in early childhood will have the opportunity to discuss a current project taking place in their laboratory.
